- School disciplinary absence (SDA) data is a total of short suspensions (1–10 days), long suspensions (11–20 days), exclusions and cancellations.
- The number of SDAs is not the number of students who received an SDA as one student may be suspended several times in a school year. Each time a student is suspended it is recorded as an additional SDA. The data do not reflect the outcomes of appeal decisions.
- The reduction in 2022 SDA counts is partially due to a reduced number of school days in Term 1, owing to the COVID-19 related delay to the start of the school year and extreme weather events during mid Term 1.
- 2020 data was impacted by the COVID-19 health emergency. There were significantly fewer SDAs during the home-based learning period (the first five weeks of Term 2) compared to previous years.
- The Department of Education has eight integrated service-delivery regions across Queensland.
